Kelsey Smith Case Overview

On June 2, 2007, Kelsey Smith was abducted from an Overland Park, KS Target Store. Friends and family started a massive search for Kelsey. Cell phone technology was used to find the last location that she could have been in. On June 6, 2007, Kelsey's body was found. During these four days many forensic disciplines were hard at work helping in any way that would aid the investigation. Edwin Hall was arrested the same day that Kelsey's body was found. On July 23, 2008, Hall pled guilty to all four charges of kidnapping, rape, sodomy and capital murder. He is now serving a life sentence without the possibility of parole.
